



## ***C.R. GIBBS***

**Author, Lecturer, Civil War Historian**

Mr. C.R. Gibbs is an internationally noted lecturer, exhibitor of historical artifacts, and historian of the African Diaspora. He is the author/co-author of six books including "Black Explorers, 2300 B.C. To The Present," "Black Inventors: From Africa To America," and "Black, Copper, & Bright: The District of Columbia's Black Civil War Regiment," the subject of an upcoming documentary by Three Dimensional Publishing.

He has served as an assistant technical adviser to the Francis Thompson Company on a film entitled "American Years" and as a consultant to Georgetown University, the Smithsonian Institution, and Maryland Public Television.

He researched, wrote, and narrated "Sketches In Color," a 13-part companion series to the PBS series "The Civil War" for the Howard University TV station. A D.C. Humanities Council Scholar, Mr. Gibbs has also appeared on the History Channel and C-Span. He is also a member of the Company of Military Historians. He has also authored several articles and lectured widely on various aspects of African Americans and the Civil War. The Smithsonian Institution's Anacostia Museum and Center for African American History and Culture Museum website features Mr. Gibbs among its scholars at the museum's Online Academy.
